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THE CHARM OF BELA VISTA IS UNVEILED AT GRAND LAPA, MACAU

<u>Grand Lapa, Macau</u> announced the opening of <u>Café Bela Vista</u> in June 2004, a charming new restaurant within the hotel that is reminiscent of the splendour of the historic former landmark, Hotel Bela Vista.

Once an enchanting boutique address and luxury Mandarin Oriental property, the Hotel Bela Vista was located amidst elegant landscaped gardens on the slope of Macau's tranquil Colinha da Penha overlooking the Praia Grande Bay. A part of the history of Macau since the late 1800's, Hotel Bela Vista underwent a multi-million dollar restoration in 1992 under the management of Mandarin Oriental Hotel Group. In March 1999, the hotel became the residence of the first Portuguese Consul General in Macau.

Within the new restaurant design, careful consideration of the former hotel's classic elegance and colonial architecture has been retained, ensuring Café Bela Vista reflects the authentic historical character of a traditional Portuguese family home. This is evident from the classic columns to the mosaic floors.

At the entrance of Café Bela Vista is a Portuguese mosaic stone pavement. The interiors include dark wood flooring, ceiling fans, chandeliers and wall sconces that take diners back to the main dining room of Hotel Bela Vista.

One of the highlights of Café Bela Vista is the spacious colonial veranda with columns and balustrades, complete with wicker chairs, Portuguese tile floors, palm trees, louvered shutters and white ceiling fans.



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An added feature of the restaurant includes an open kitchen with live cooking stations and a wide variety selection of Asian dishes. Behind this open kitchen is an eye-catching yellow painted granite wall which reflects the bright and warm façade of the hotel building. Café Bela Vista menu features popular Asian dishes as well as international favourites with authentic Macanese and Portuguese specialities such as Portuguese antipasto and cold cut platter with traditional delicacies including bacalhau balls, shrimp pies, octopus salad, curado serra cheese and marinated olives.

Café Bela Vista serves daily breakfast buffet, and enticing semi-buffet lunch with a selection of main courses as well as appetizers and dessert buffet, and sumptuous weekend seafood dinner buffet over weekends. Located on the 2nd level, the restaurant is open on Mondays to Thursdays from 6:30am to 3pm and 6pm to 10pm, Fridays to Sundays from 6:30am until 10pm. Serving authentic Cantonese cuisine created by multi-award-winning chef

Located on the 2nd floor of Grand Lapa, Macau, Kam Lai Heen replaces the former, Michelin starred Tung Yee Heen, and was designed by multi-award-winning architectural company DNL, and has taken on a new look with a dramatic entrance decorated with gold flowers, petals and green crystals hanging from the ceiling to welcome guests. The main dining room accommodates 80 guests with an additional eight VIP rooms for private dining, hosting from 6 to 12 guests.

It features floor-to-ceiling glass panel walls overlooking the tropical garden. A skylight at the centre of the restaurant adds to its lightness, and beneath this is a beautiful water feature recalling the name of the restaurant – NAAM, a Thai word for water.

Everything you see at the table comes from Thailand, including part of the staff and kitchen team in the restaurant. They have been trained at our sister hotel, The Oriental, Bangkok – one of the best hotels in the world, creating beautiful and authentic Thai delicacies.

Born and educated in Thailand, Executive Thai Chef Chatsorn Pratoomma (commonly known as Chef Sorn) brings to NAAM extensive culinary experience gained from major international hotels and restaurants in Thailand since 1998. Most recently she worked for renowned hotel in Bangkok for six years before joining Grand Lapa, Macau. While maintaining the favourite signature dishes, Chef Sorn promised to bring advocates of NAAM some excitements with her new menu.

In the menu, it features all the Thai favourites from different regions from Yam Som-O (herbed pomelo salad with chicken and prawns) to Tom Yam Goong (spicy prawn soup with lemongrass), and Phad Phed Gare (stir-fried lamb with red curry paste and eggplants) to Pla-Ga Pong Nueng Samoon Prai (steamed fish with assorter Thai herbs sauce), all prepared to a wonderful standard. We also feature a special menu of infused Thai teas, including lemongrass tea and the traditional Thai iced tea.
