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## **MANDARIN ORIENTAL, MUNICH – TRADITION MEETS MODERNITY**

Ideally located in the heart of Munich's old town Mandarin Oriental, Munich is surrounded by museums, the State Opera, the famous Hofbraeuhaus and the exclusive Maximilian shopping street. Some of the finest restaurants, boulevard cafés, art galleries and traditional gourmet markets are just a stone's throw away. Within this lively, cultural and enticing environment, Mandarin Oriental, Munich marks a symbiosis of the classic style of Neo-Renaissance and traditional Bavarian elegance, combined with contemporary luxury. In 2015, the hotel once again confirmed its position as Munich's leading luxury hotel: following an extensive refurbishment of all public areas, Mandarin Oriental, Munich unveiled a new and modern lobby and lounge, a brand new bar as well as restaurant "Matsuhisa, Munich", world-renowned Chef Nobu Matsuhisa's first outpost in Germany.

### **From an opera house to one of the city's finest addresses**

Built in 1880, originally hosting the city's ballroom, the Neo-Renaissance building became a hotel in 1990 and was operated by the Rafael Hotel Group before Mandarin Oriental Hotel Group took over in 2000. Mandarin Oriental, Munich rapidly established itself as one of Munich's grandest properties and nowadays represents one of the best addresses in the Bavarian capital as well as in the country. While offering the legendary service of Mandarin Oriental, modern amenities ensure the comfort and convenience that one would expect from a world class luxury hotel.

### **Living in comfort and with style**

Each of the hotel's 48 spacious guest rooms and 25 lavish suites, has been individually furnished and decorated providing both comfort and elegance whilst offering the latest in technology. This includes in-room high speed internet, Bang & Olufsen flat-screen television sets with over 300 channels and integrated DVD player, CD players and radios.

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### **Dine & Drink at Mandarin Oriental, Munich**

With the opening of the restaurant “Matsuhisa, Munich” in November 2015, Mandarin Oriental, Munich introduced the award-winning cuisine of internationally celebrated Chef Nobuyuki (Nobu) Matsuhisa to Germany. It follows the same successful format as Matsuhisa Beverly Hills and five other exclusive dependences around the world. Offering Nobu’s renowned New Style Japanese-Peruvian cuisine, and with an emphasis on seafood, the menu of chef Loris di Santo will feature signature dishes such as the legendary Black Cod and Yellowfin Tuna Sashimi with Jalapeños, alongside Grilled Lamb, cooked over Tealeaves, with Peruvian Anticucho Sauce, as well as traditionally prepared Sushi. Matsuhisa, Munich opens daily for dinner. Furthermore the restaurant serves special menus and bento boxes during lunch time in the rooms of Bar31.

Bar31 opened its doors on October 31<sup>st</sup> 2015 on the ground floor of Mandarin Oriental, Munich. It features a rounded marble bar with oversized freestanding champagne cooler as its centerpiece. Elegantly designed with moss, silver and petrol blue interiors, the bar exudes a sophisticated atmosphere that evolves from relaxed to vibrant as evening approaches. Exotic drinks invite guests to experience classic cocktails in a different and unique way. Furthermore, guests enjoy selected Matsuhisa dishes. During lunch time, Matsuhisa, Munich serves special menus and bento boxes in the rooms of Bar31. Open daily from 12 to 2pm (Matsuhisa Lunch) and from 6pm to 1am (until 2am on weekends).

Adjacent to the newly designed lobby area, The Lounge is the ideal retreat and meeting place for hotel guests. Dominating colors are gold, bright green and purple. Besides coffee, afternoon tea and cake specialties, international snacks are being served at midday and evening.

Particularly popular during the summer months, the China Moon Roof Terrace on the roof top on the eighth floor offers a heated swimming pool as well as breathtaking 360° views over the cityscape and the Alps. The terrace is open daily for lunch and dinner from May to October.

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### **Private events at Mandarin Oriental, Munich**

On the first floor, Mandarin Oriental, Munich offers three newly designed rooms for private events or meetings with up to 150 people. All of the spaces benefit from natural daylight, high speed internet and wireless internet access. Guests can choose between three different food styles, which make the banquet offer of Mandarin Oriental, Munich very special. There is the Japanese-Peruvian Matsuhisa food as well as classic international dishes and fine dining food, prepared by executive chef, Simon Larese, who was awarded with a Michelin star. The hotel's event offer can be combined with lunch, dinner or receptions in one of the new outlets, like "Matsuhisa, Munich" or "Bar31".

### **Stay active away on travel**

The hotel's Fitness and Wellnes Center (150m<sup>2</sup>) is located at the ground floor of the hotel. The Fitness area houses a wide range of state-of-the-art equipment from TechnoGym and a Kinesis Wall. A personal trainer is bookable on individual request through the concierge. The Wellness area is home to a Turkish steam bath and also a Finnish Sauna.

Munich offers diverse possibilities for passionate joggers, for example with the popular park "Englischer Garten". Suitable routes can be obtained by asking the hotel's concierge.
