Refreshing granitas, such as 'Virgin Mojito', are offered too.

To fully enjoy dining and relaxing outdoors at the hotel, guests can book one of its sumptuous suites with large terraces that overlook either the peaceful garden or the city's iconic rooftops and monuments. The <u>Suite Royale Orientale</u> and <u>Panoramic Suite</u> each have a 75-square metre roof terrace with lounge, dining and spa area, and elegant pergola, all enveloped within extensive greenery that enhances views of the Opera district, Montmartre and L'église de la Madeleine.
