
VOYAGE WITH VAN GOGH



SONGKRAN HK 2024

Also known as the 'Thai New Year', is an important traditional festival in Thailand. People engage in cheerful water fights on the streets, which symbolises the washing away of misfortunes and evil from the past year, and welcoming the arrival of the new year. The SongKran HK is held annually to celebrate this traditional and grand festival. Apart from dedicated watersplashing, the SongKran HK 2024 will include traditional rituals, the Nang Songkran Parade, a Chatuchak-style market, Thai street food stalls, traditional Thai dance performances, and Thai traditional costumes experience. This vibrant Thai cultural event welcomes both locals and visitors to come and celebrate by splashing water on each other.

A fun and informative introduction to the traditional art of Cantonese opera specially designed to appeal to audiences of all ages. The 90-minute, interactive showcase, performed by the young actors and musicians of the Tea House Rising Stars Troupe, includes engaging Cantonese opera excerpts and demonstrations of traditional Cantonese music. Each segment is also narrated by an expert host, offering insight into a variety of performance styles and musical sounds.

FACTORY OF TOMORROW

Endeavours to critically examine the past and evoke imagination for what is to come. From textile works and sculptures to immersive installations and videos, it brings together creations by 19 artists and collectives of Asian backgrounds, reflecting their takes on textile technology and materials, diversity, climate change and our future.

The exhibition is roughly divided into two parts. The first part showcases works of contemporary art collected by CHAT over the years and explores the role of textile in Hong Kong's industrial past through the artists' eyes. The second part then looks to the present and future, using new mediums and technologies to address various issues and perspectives.
