Aries by Jason Hackenwerth at Mandarin Oriental, Hong Kong

Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD) alumnus and international artist Jason Hackenwerth will exhibit a custom balloon installation at Mandarin Oriental, Hong Kong, where his work will be suspended from the hotel lobby ceiling. Students from SCAD Hong Kong will help create the bright, brilliant, and kinetic sculpture—titled *Aries*—that will feature orange, magenta, and pink hues, immersing guests in the gradient glow of the sculptural forms. The giant, whimsical sculpture—created with hundreds of latex balloons—will be on display from Monday, 9 March, to Thursday, 19 March, and best viewed from the [Clipper Lounge](#) restaurant.

Imagined Geographies at The Clipper Lounge

From 9 to 19 March, the [Clipper Lounge](#) will home “Imagined Geographies”.
