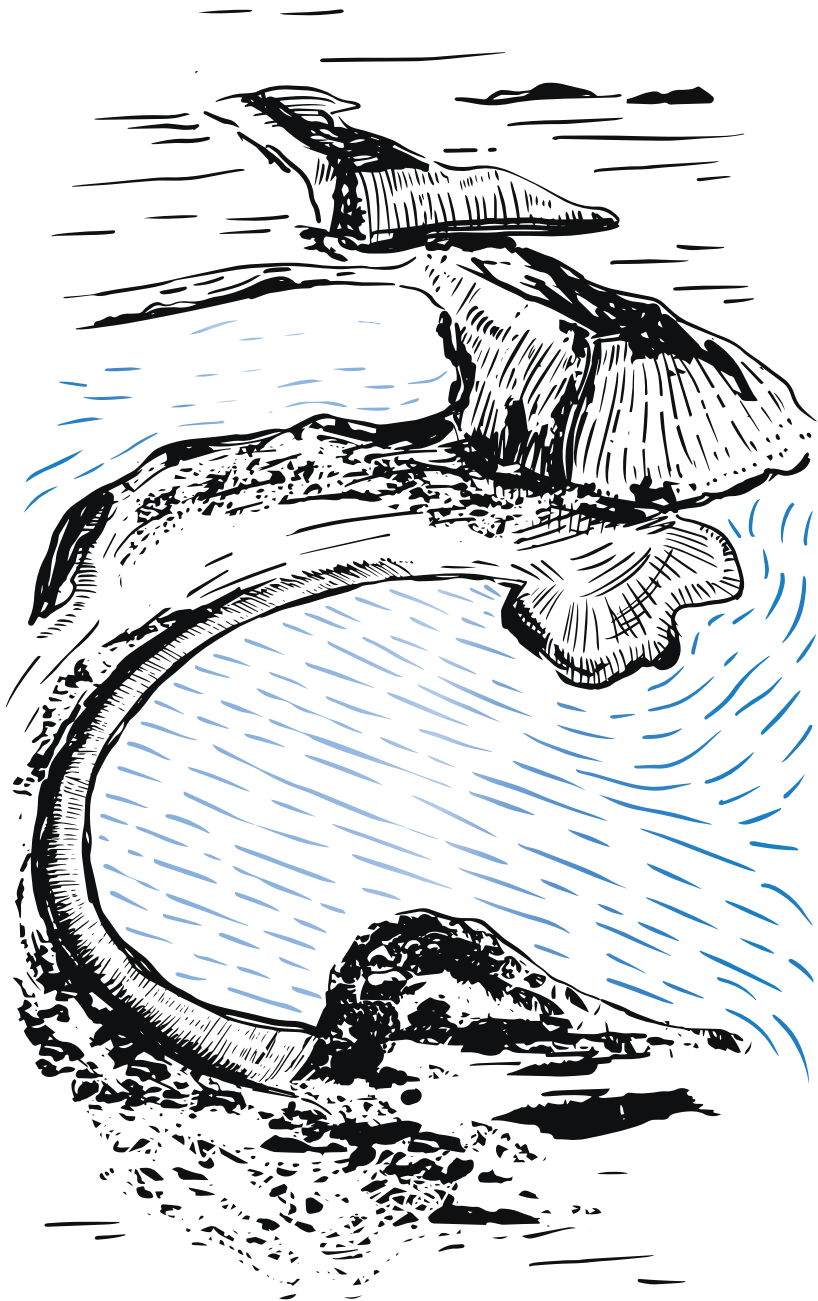

The Greek War of Independence, which began in 1821, sought to liberate Greece from nearly four centuries of Ottoman rule. By 1827, the conflict had escalated into a full-scale war, drawing the attention of major European powers. Russia, France, and Britain, despite their own rivalries, shared a common interest in weakening the Ottoman Empire.

Through diplomatic efforts, a combined British, French, and Russian fleet, known as the Allied Fleet, was dispatched to the eastern Mediterranean under the command of Admiral Edward Codrington. The aftermath of Navarino was significant. It led to the eventual recognition of Greek independence by the Great Powers and the signing of the Treaty of London in 1830, establishing Greece as an independent nation.

The battle's impact reverberated across Europe, marking a shift in the balance of power in the Mediterranean and demonstrating the growing influence of naval firepower in modern warfare.

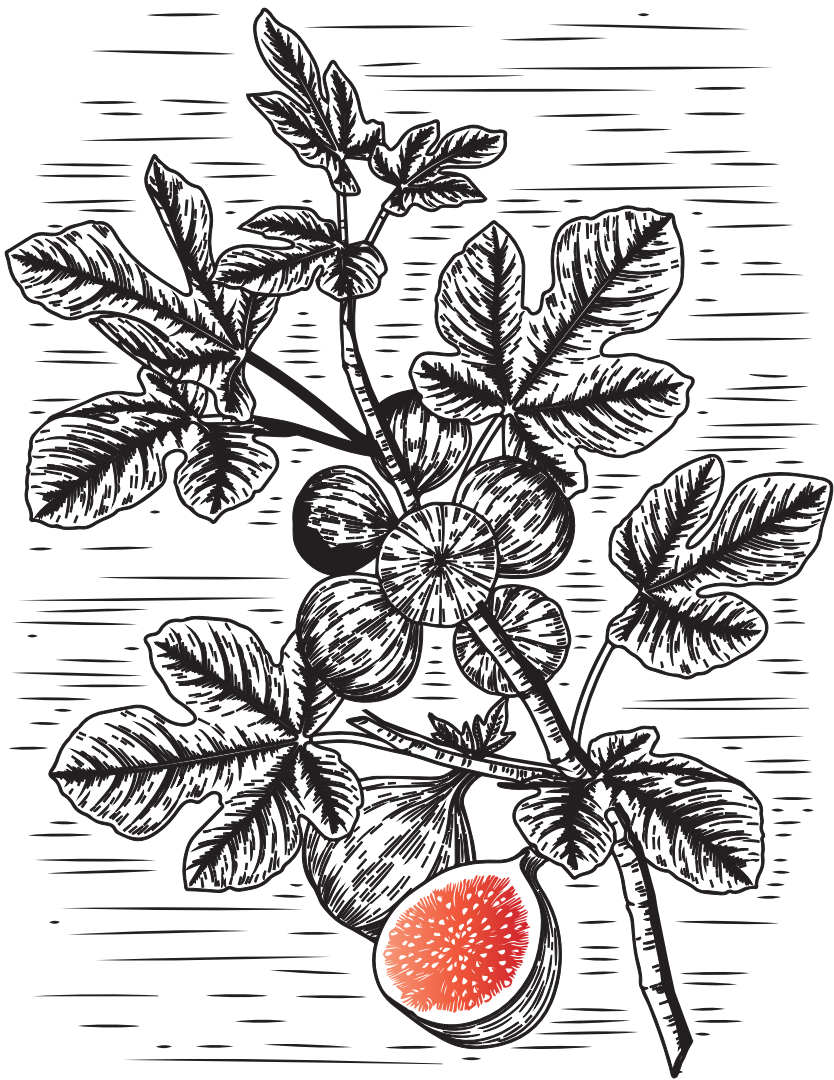

The rosemary (ancient Greek απόσπληνος), also known as arismari, in Cyprus is known by the name lasmari. It is an aromatic, evergreen shrub belonging to the genus Rosmarinus and the family Lamiaceae. The Latin name of the plant, Rosmarinus, means "dew of the sea" and is composed of the words ros (dew) and marinus (of the sea), because it was believed that the plant could thrive without watering, relying only on the humidity coming from the sea.

Located in our right side of the terrace, our rosemary gardens provide flavour to our gastronomic as well as our mixology program.
