

COCKTAILS DELLA CASA

- Grotta Azzurra** 80
A famous natural landmark in Capri, blending Blue Spirulina, lychee syrup, pineapple cordial, and soda to achieve Azzurro or light blue, representing the national color of Italy
- Amalfi** 85
Famous for its lemons cultivation and the birthplace of limoncello liquor. This vibrant drink combines limoncello, elderflower, and a popular Italian variation of the Hugo Spritz
- La Piana di Catania** 85
Named after the region of Sicily that boasts the largest plain on the island and is renowned for its blood oranges. This cocktail blends blood oranges with Aperol and sparkling wine, offering an Italian twist on the famous Aperol Spritz
- Giardino di Ninfa** 80
This drink is inspired by the old and beautiful natural monument of Italy located in the historic town of Cisterno di Latino. It features distinctive green color from basil, thyme, gin, and tonic
- Villa Ghigi** 80
Combining light fruity flavors and herbal notes, this cocktail features pears, apple cordial, Jim Beam whiskey and fresh rosemary - a herb commonly used in Italian kitchens. The fruit is named after one of the largest orchards in the Emilia-Romagna region
- Salento** 85
This Italian commune, renowned for its olive oil production, offers a traditional iced coffee known as Caffè Salentino. In this cocktail, it's mixed with amaretto cold brew, cacao nibs infused tequila, olive oil and almond milk foam
- Vesuvio** 85
A light sour cocktail made with fresh apricots and a hint of rose, named after the famous Vesuvius National Park, where some of the world's sweetest apricots are grown. It's infused with Bacardi white rum
- Monte Conero** 80
Named after the famous mountain slope in Italy where strawberry trees are found. This sweet and tart drink combines rosemary, basil, strawberry gin and balsamic vinegar, evoking the colors of the Italian flag
