
GALERIE 208, INSTALLED AT MANDARIN ORIENTAL, MARRAKECH, SHOWCASES THE EXCEPTIONAL EXHIBITION OF MAHI BINEBINE "SILENT ELEVATIONS"

Galerie 208 and Mandarin Oriental, Marrakech are honoured to present "Silent Elevations", an exclusive exhition devoted to the internationally renowned Moroccan artist, Mahi Binebine. Through a unique selection of large-scale sculptures and vibrant paintings, the exhibition invites visitors to plunge into a profoundly humane universe where every detail embodies a fragment of history.

This exhibition, that takes place from 29 January until 28 March 2025, is a first in Morocco: for the very first time, a large selection of monumental sculptures created by Mahi Binebine will be uncovered, alongside a collection of paintings showcased in an exceptional scenography. Among the series exhibited, one has recently caught the eye of the Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), which has added one of these pieces to its prestigious collection.

The exhibition is part of 1-54, the international art fair dedicated to contemporary art from Africa and its diaspora, as well as "Le Festival du Livre Africain de Marrakech". In tandem with this display, Galerie 208 is also participating in 1-54, where it will be showcasing a selection of works by Mahi Binebine, as well as Armand Boua and eL Seed, who will soon to be unveiled at Mandarin Oriental.

About the artist



Mahi Binebine, born in 1959 in Marrakech, is emblematic figure of the Moroccan After contemporary scene. studying mathemetics in Paris, he taught for many years before devoting himself to writing and painting. His works were presented in prestigious institutions like the Guggenheim Museum in New York. The author of twelve novels, including Les Étoiles de Sidi Moumen, adapted for the screen by Nabil Ayouch as Les Chevaux de Dieu. Binebine is also co-founder of the Festival du Livre Africain de Marrakech (FLAM), celebrating African literature and culture.

Committed in cultural development, he chairs, in collaboration with the Ali Zaoua Foundation, six cultural centers "Les Étoiles", offering to disadvantaged children access to art and education. Today, he lives and works in his hometown, Marrakech, where he continues to create and inspire.

On this occasion, numbered lithographs signed by the artist will be exclusively available, in a privileged setting reserved for 60 participants.





An introspective journey to the heart of humanity

In his artpieces, Mahi Binebine explores the paradoxes of the human condition: the shadow and the light, groundedness and spiritual elevation, memory and oblivion. As Albert Camus wrote in The Myth of Sisyphus, a quote dear to the artist's heart: "In the middle of winter, I discovered an invincible summer inside me." This message of hope resonates deeply in Binebine's creations, where the harshness of the material rubs shoulders with the poetry of dreams and transcendence. His sculptures, imbued with mystery and power, embody silent narratives where violence and gentleness, exile and belonging intersect. His paintings and basreliefs capture the fragile moment when man transcends his limits to dream, resist or build.
